


## Something important happened in 2011...

In 2018, 100% of the top 200 grossing games on Google Play Store had "addictive" as the most used word in reviews, with a large margin. I raised this into public awareness, and Google responded by remove the keywords from the Play Store.








## OECD average trends in mathematics, reading and science

## Time spent on digital devices at school and mathematics performance


Based on students' reports; OECD average

Percentage of students who reported that the following happens in every or in most of their mathematics lessons




## TikTok shapes its users views.




This is not surprising when you consider that for every view of a TikTok video with a pro-Israel hashtag in the US, there are 54 views of videos with pro-Palestinian hashtags.

In fact, FreePalestine is currently one of the top-performing hashtags across all of TikTok.

## In Finland, TikTok lifts the far right.

A recent study by Labore shows a statistically significant 10% increase in the support of the far right conservatives among TikTok users when compared to youth that doesn't use TikTok. It is a significant number to attribute to a single source of information.

## Many dangerous challenges spread on TikTok.

#### The Boat Challenge

One of TikTok's most recent and alarming trends is the boat challenge. Participants engage in daring acts by jumping or flipping off the backs of speeding boats, intending to capture the dangerous feat on camera. Tragically, this challenge has led to multiple fatalities, as participants have suffered broken necks and drownings upon impact with the water's surface.

#### Fire Challenge

The Fire Challenge is an extremely hazardous trend in which participants douse themselves in flammable substances and set themselves on fire, aiming to extinguish the flames before sustaining significant injuries. However, this challenge often results in severe burns, disfigurement, and long-term physical and psychological trauma. It has been a cause of concern for authorities due to the life-threatening risks it poses.

#### The Scarf Game (Blackout Challenge)

Another deadly challenge that gained notoriety on TikTok is the Scarf Game, also known as the Blackout Challenge. This dangerous trend involves participants intentionally cutting off their oxygen supply, often by using a scarf or belt, to induce a state of temporary unconsciousness. Tragically, this challenge has resulted in fatal consequences, with individuals losing their lives due to asphyxiation. Despite warnings and efforts to raise awareness about its dangers, the Scarf Game continues to pose a significant threat.

#### The Skull Breaker Challenge

The Skull Breaker Challenge gained notoriety for its shocking and dangerous nature. It involves three participants standing side by side, with the person in the middle unaware of the impending danger. As the trio jumps into the air, the individuals on the sides kick the middle person's legs, causing them to lose balance and fall violently. This challenge has resulted in severe injuries, including head trauma, concussions, and broken bones.

#### The Outlet Challenge

The Outlet Challenge is yet another hazardous TikTok trend that involves inserting the prongs of a charger partially into an electrical outlet. Participants then proceeded to touch the exposed metal, resulting in an electric shock. This ill-advised challenge has led to severe burns, injuries, and even house fires. The potentially life-threatening consequences of tampering with electricity underscore the need for vigilance and responsible social media usage.


#### The Benadryl Challenge

The Benadryl Challenge involves individuals consuming excessive amounts of the over-the-counter antihistamine medication, Benadryl, in an attempt to induce hallucinations. This dangerous challenge can lead to severe side effects, including heart problems, seizures, and even overdose. Several cases have been reported where participants required emergency medical assistance due to the adverse effects of this challenge. A 13-year-old boy in Ohio reportedly died after attempting this dangerous TikTok trend.




## Is there hope?
